Questions from Consultants

The following summarizes questions related to the Request for Qualifications for the Route 10 Corridor Transportation Study along with CROC's responses. Further questions will be posted as addendums on our website (www.crcog.org).

What would the Town of Simsbury like to see come out of the process of this study?

The purpose of this transportation study is to address safety, access management and development potential / growth along the Route 10 corridor in the Town of Simsbury. The town would like to see the future traffic needs of the Route 10 corridor met in a safe and efficient way that also seeks to implement the visions put forth in recent community visioning exercises such as the Simsbury Center Charrette. The town would also like to accomplish these transportation goals in a way that maintains the existing character of the corridor.

In order to build on what the Town of Simsbury has already started in recent planning exercises, what does the town see as the next steps to take during this study?

Next steps for this study are to build upon recommendations from past and recent studies by identifying constraints and opportunities for roadway modifications based upon forecasts of future traffic conditions along the 7-mile corridor.

Additional Materials

The Town of Simsbury has done a significant amount of planning for Route 10 both in the past and more recently. These planning efforts have produced recommendations that this study should build upon. Past efforts include the Route 10 Corridor Improvement and Management Plan and Route 10 Study Recommendations Summary.
